### Photographic Exhibition Portrays New HKUST Campus

The Hong Kong University of Science and Technology (HKUST) announces a photographic exhibition, "Building a University Through the Lens of Lee Ka-sing", at the Cultural Centre in Tsimshatsui. The exhibition will run from 25-30 September, with opening hours of 9 a.m.- 12 midnight. HKUST is Hong Kong's third and newest university; construction of the modern campus on the Clear Water Bay peninsula has just been completed. In the exhibition, professional photographer Lee Ka-sing portrays with bold style and dramatic perspectives some of the new campus's most outstanding architectural features.

Designed by Simon Kwan & Associates and built with government funds and a donation of close to HK\$2 billion from The Royal Hong Kong Jockey Club, the HKUST campus is expected to become an architectural landmark in Hong Kong. Bold geometric shapes and patterns, primary colours and grand scale dominate its modern design. Among the campus's most striking features are a monumental semi-circular facade partially enclosing the entrance Piazza and a spacious central Atrium with barrel-vaulted skylight. The exhibition photographs capture the beauty of the campus, particularly in its architectural detail.

Named Photographer of the Year in 1989 by the Hong Kong Artists' Guild, Lee Ka-sing is one of Hong Kong's finest professional photographers. Since turning his career from design to photography, he has mounted numerous exhibitions in Hong Kong on topics ranging from poetry to artists' self-portraits, and has received gold and silver awards in photography in shows of the Hong Kong Designers' Association (HKDA).
