**T.K. Ng of HKUST receives Honourable Mention in  
"Achievement in Asia Award 1993"**

Dr Tai-Kai Ng, Lecturer in the Physics Department of the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology, has received an Honourable Mention of the "Achievement in Asia Award 1993", which is conferred by the Overseas Chinese Physics Association (OCPA).

Dr Ng was honoured for his work in theoretical condensed matter physics, and in particular for his contributions to the understanding of quantum mechanical effects in small electronic devices at low temperature.

The "Achievement in Asia Award", which was instituted this year by OCPA, is designed to recognise significant achievement by physicists working in Asia. OCPA is a professional, non-political, not-for-profit organization incorporated in the State of New York, with the chartered goals of promoting physics research in general, and of promoting recognition of the achievements of ethnic Chinese scientists. Members of OCPA includes world famous physicists such as C.N. Yang and T.D. Lee.

Dr Ng received his PhD in Northwestern University in 1987. Before joining HKUST in 1991, he worked as a Postdoctoral Associate in the Theoretical Physics Research Department of AT&T Bell Labs.
